

## The Naval Club of Toronto

### CLUB ACTIVITIES

- CLUB HOURS:** 1200 to 0100 daily, Monday to Friday, 1200 to 2000 Saturday. The Club is closed Sunday except for special functions and certain specified public holidays.
- GUESTS:** Guests are welcome at all times but must be signed in by the Member, who will be responsible for their conduct. Guests are to leave when the member leaves. Do not sign in someone you do not know. To avoid identification confusion by the Stewards, accompany your guest to the bar when ordering drinks and set an example by RETURNING BOTTLES & GLASSES to the bar each time you re-order and when you leave the Club.
- NEW MEMBERS:** Only NAVAL members are allowed to sponsor new applicants. Ensure you know the applicant before you PRINT your name and Membership # on application form.
- APPLICATIONS:** Applicants are not automatically accepted by the Membership Committee. There are priorities and limitations laid down by the Constitution and by the Executive Committee.
- GENERAL MEETING:** The Club is managed and controlled by an elected Executive. The Constitution calls for 6 bi-monthly meetings annually. Meetings are open to NAVAL (Blue-Card) ASSOCIATE (Green-Card) and SOCIAL MEMBERS (Yellow-Card). NO GUESTS are permitted. Meetings commence at 1930 on the third Tuesday of January, March, May, July, September and November.

- WORK PARTIES:** The Club requires a good deal of maintenance to uphold our housekeeping standards. If you have any special skills, or are just handy, willing worker, please contact the House Chairman or any member of the Executive.
- GLEE CLUB:** The Club has an excellent Glee Club. If you have a good voice and enjoy singing, you are very welcome to join. The Glee Club meets each Monday night at 1900 at the Naval Club. The Glee Club provided free concerts for nursing homes, hospitals and retirement homes.
- WELFARE JUG:** Deposit any loose change in the bottle on the bar. All this money goes to the Sick & Welfare Fund.
- COLOUR PARTY:** Colour Party services are currently being provided by the Toronto Sea Cadet Alumni Association (affiliated with the Naval Club of Toronto). They parade on Battle of Atlantic Sunday in May, D-Day Ceremony in June, Warriors Day Parade in August and Remembrance Day in November.

- UPPER DECK:** Our major dances, meetings and services are held on the Upper Deck. It has a licensed capacity of 185 people, and is equipped with its own galley and bar. There is a stage and a large dance floor. For a dinner/dance, 120 persons is a comfortable number. The room is available on a rental basis for Members and some outside groups. The 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President or the Chief Steward is the contact person for all information regarding rental.
- 25¢ DRAW:** Draw for members only. Deposit 25¢ and enter your name and membership number in book provided. If your number is drawn and you have "signed in" that day, you will receive 50% of the accumulated money in box.

- LOONIE DRAW:** Draw for members only. The loonie draw box is situated to the left of the bar, this is drawn periodically and the winning membership number receives 50% of the loonies in the box. Place your loonie in envelope provided, print your name and number clearly on envelope and place it in the box.
- SIGNAL HOIST:** In the middle of the Club room there are four small flag hoists. Each week four membership numbers are drawn and the appropriate numbered flags are hoisted. If you see and recognize your number on the hoist, then you will receive one free drink every day for the week.
- SHIPS BELL:** **BEWARE** - Any member or their guest who rings the Bell buys a round of drinks for the House. It is a serious offence to ring the bell unless you fully intend to buy drinks for the house. If you wish to buy drinks, please forewarn the Steward so he is prepared for the rush at the bar.
- EUCHRE:** House League Euchre is played every second Saturday. Bring a guest. READ YOUR TELEGRAPH for details.
- BRIDGE:** House League Bridge is played on alternate Saturdays to Euchre. READ YOUR TELEGRAPH for details. Bring a guest.
- MEAT ROLL:** Meat roll is held every second Saturday and is played on the same Saturday as the House League Bridge. READ YOUR TELEGRAPH for details. Bring a guest. This is a good chance to win your Sunday Dinner.
- DARTS:** Mixed House League is on Friday evenings at 20:00. Teams are established each September and sometimes there is room for spares. Competitive, but it is a fun league. Everyone is welcome to participate. Individual games can be played at anytime, except during League matches.
- DRESS:** Although there is not normally a strict dress code in the Club, members and their guests are expected to be appropriately dressed for the occasion. Shirts/tops must be worn at all times. Cut-offs are not permitted nor are tee-shirts with inappropriate slogans. Track pants are discouraged in the evenings. On certain occasions; Battle of Atlantic, Remembrance Day, Levee Day etc., strict dress code is in effect. Blues and greys, uniform or semi formal only permitted.
- HATS:** Male members and their male guests must remove head gear (Religious reasons excepted) before entering the Club room. Failure to do so will result in buying a round of drinks for the house.
- COATS & SHOPPING:** Please use the coat racks in games room and back lobby for your coats, do not drape them over spare tables. Shopping/Sports equipment etc. should be left in back lobby not on and between tables or in aisles. Apart from the safety risk, it inconveniences other members and their guests and makes the place untidy.
